Book in a Bag Report



A “Book in a Bag” is a book report contained in a brown paper bag. The purpose of the outside of the bag is to interest a classmate to want to read your book. The inside of your bag should include items that you will be able to use to explain important parts of your book.

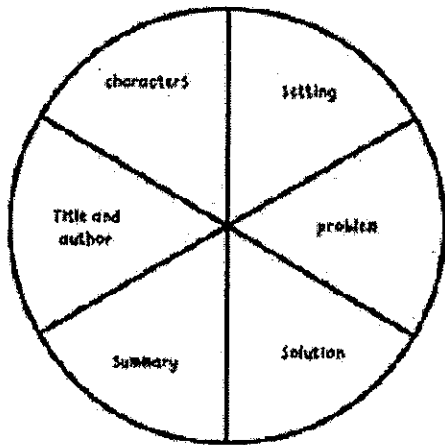
Material suggestions:

You will need a clean, brown paper bag, colored pencils or markers, crayons, scotch tape or glue stick, and paper.

Project requirements:

1. On the **front** of the bag neatly write:
 - a) Title of the Book
 - b) Author of the Book
 - c) Draw a picture of the main character(s)
2. On the **back** of the bag neatly write a paragraph about your favorite of the story. The paragraph can be written on lined paper, cut out and glued to the bag. (Your paragraph should be 8 – 10 sentences long.) Also write your opinion about the book. Did you like it? If you did like it, tell why? If you did not like it, tell why you didn't.
3. On one **side** of the bag write a short summary of the book.
4. On the **opposite side** of the bag list the **main characters** and the **setting** (describe where the story takes place).
5. Collect **5 items** to help you tell the class about your book when you present the report in class. During the oral presentation you will:
 - Give a short summary of the story
 - Explain why you selected the objects in the bag and how they connect to the book

PIZZA SLICE BOOK REPORT



MATERIALS NEEDED:

- LARGE CARDBOARD OR PAPER CIRCLE, CONSTRUCTION PAPER
- PENCIL / CRAYONS / MARKERS / SCISSORS / GLUE
- A BOOK!

6 SLICES OF INFORMATION!

- SLICE 1:** **Characters:** make a list of all the characters in the book.
- SLICE 2:** **Setting:** Describe in detail where most of the story takes place.
- SLICE 3:** **Problem:** Describe a problem in the story. Use details
- SLICE 4:** **Solution:** Describe how the problem is solved.
- SLICE 5:** **Summary:** Describe what the story was mostly about.
- SLICE 6:** **Title/Author:** Write the title and author of the story.

Story Chain

What you'll need:

ten sentence strips, pens or markers, tape

Steps:

- 1 On the first sentence strip, write the title and the author of the novel you read.
- 2 On the second sentence strip, tell where the story is taking place.
- 3 On the third sentence strip, tell who the characters are in the novel. Give a brief description of each character.
- 4 Choose seven important events in the story. Write one event on each of the seven remaining sentence strips. Make sure you include enough details about the event so that an outsider who hasn't read the book would understand the sequence of the story.
- 5 Use your sentence strips to make a linked chain. Make sure you tape them together in order.
